

Brigadier General Federico Juste de Santa Ana, DCOS MCCE



Brigadier General Federico Juste de Santa Ana was born on February 8, 1966, in Sevilla (o Seville, lo que prefiráis), Spain, and entered the General Air Academy at the age of 18, being promoted to Lieutenant on July 10, 1989.

He later rose to Captain in 1992, Major in 2000, Lieutenant Colonel in 2010, and Colonel in 2017. In November 2023, he was promoted to Brigadier General.

He holds a degree from the General Staff of the Armed Forces. He has completed courses in Telecommunications and Electronic Warfare, Basic Parachuting for Commanders, Specialist in NBC Defense, Security and Defense, Interception Controller, Cartography and Photography, Communication and

Observation Satellite Systems, Joint Information and Telecommunications Systems, INFOSEC, NATO CIS Orientation Officers Course, Basic Frequency Management NARFA SP, and NATO Frequency Management Course, among others.

Notable posts that he has covered include the 35th Wing, the Royal Guard, the Headquarters Group of MACEN, the 21st Air Surveillance Squadron, and the Transmission Group. After completing the General Staff Course, he was assigned to the JSTCIBER, where he held positions including Head of the Telecommunications Section and Head of the Information Systems Section. He commanded the Transmission Group for three years as Colonel.

He has participated in ISAF missions (Afghanistan) five times, as well as in EUNAVFOR (Atalanta) and EUFOR (Chad-CAR)

As of November 30, 2023, he has been appointed Deputy Commander of the Joint Cyber Command (MCCE).

He is married and has four children.
